THURSDAY, MAY 3 – SUNDAY, MAY 6, 2018

SAN RAFAEL, CA (December 11, 2017) – Mark Fishkin, Founder / Director of the internationally known Mill Valley Film Festival and Executive Director / Founder of the California Film Institute (CFI), announced revised dates for the 2nd annual documentary film festival DOCLANDS, will be held Thursday, May 3 – Sunday, May 6, 2018 in Marin County, California.

The 2018 Festival is set to build on the momentum from its inaugural edition, which hosted 40 feature length and short documentary films, including 18 premieres from 11 countries, showcasing documentary films in a variety of genres and diversity of content.

Submissions for the 2018 Festival opened November 1, 2017 for traditional and innovative feature length (40 + minutes) and short documentary films. Filmmakers can submit a film for consideration via upload through Film Freeway and WithoutABox. No DVDs or external links will be considered. Presentation formats accepted are 35mm and DCP only.

- **NOVEMBER 1, 2017 – SUBMISSIONS OPEN**
- **FEBRUARY 1, 2018 – ENTRY DEADLINE** for traditional feature length and short films
- **FEBRUARY 19, 2018 – LATE ENTRY DEADLINE** for traditional feature length and short films

Festival screenings will once again be held in Mill Valley at the CinéArts Sequoia and San Rafael at the Christopher B. Smith Rafael Film Center.
