# CFI'S VIRTUAL DOCPITCH LAUNCHES APRIL 29, 2022 WILL AWARD \$100,000 TO DOCUMENTARY FILM PROJECTS

DOCPITCH IS PART OF THE DOCLANDS DOCUMENTARY FILM FESTIVAL ONLINE MAY 5-11, 2022 IN-PERSON AT THE CHRISTOPHER B. SMITH RAFAEL FILM CENTER MAY 5-8, 2022

SAN RAFAEL, CA (April 15, 2022) – DocLands Documentary Film Festival (DocLands) announces the five finalists for **DocPitch**, a program designed to connect filmmakers, with projects currently in development or post-production, to potential funders, distributors, organizations, philanthropists, fellow filmmakers, and future audiences.

Their surprising, history-making victory is only the beginning of what becomes their ultimate mission: equity for women in the world of professional sports - and beyond.

# Standing Above the Clouds, director Jalena Keane-Lee

When the world's largest telescope is set to be built on their sacred mountain, Mauna Kea, three Native Hawaiian families dedicate their lives to defending it. Through the lens of mothers and daughters, Standing Above the Clouds explores intergenerational healing and the social and emotional labor of retaining ancient ceremonies while putting your body on the line to protect a sacred mountain.

"Since we launched DocPitch six years ago, it brought to fruition something we had long wanted to accomplish, to have the means to support documentary filmmaking in a substantial way. The importance of truth through storytelling is more critical than ever, and the integrity of this years DocPitch films are outstanding. The ability to support these worthy projects is a privilege and aligns with the mission of the California Film Institute," said CFI Founder / Executive Director Mark Fishkin. "The fact that a worldwide audience can weigh in and vote on these projects is extraordinary. Our deepest appreciation to our generous DocPitch supporters and the filmmakers sharing their incredible stories."

"Demonstrated by a near doubling of the number of DocPitch submissions this year, the word - and need - for DocLands' pitching initiative is being discovered by filmmakers everywhere. And the fruits of the probing work from past DocPitch forums are being seen during DocLands and other major film festivals this year," said DocLands Director of Programming Joni Cooper. "DocLands will present premieres of two 2018 DocPitch Finalists this year: *Scrap*, directed by Canadian Stacey Tenenbaum, will see its US Premiere, and *The Sanctity of Space*, directed by Renan Ozturk and Freddie Wilkinson, will see its California premiere in advance of its US theatrical release through Greenwich Entertainment. *The Thief Collector*, which was pitched as *The Heist* at DocPitch 2019 by director Allison Otto, is also part of the film program. These three films alone are an amazing taste of how diverse the documentary genre has become. We're incredibly grateful that our DocPitch funders and sponsors recognize the importance of impactful projects that documentary filmmakers present year after year and are pleased to provide the vehicle that brings them together to produce films that enlighten, enrich, and entertain audiences worldwide."

Designed to connect filmmakers and their ideas to funders, distributors, philanthropic organizations, philanthropists, fellow filmmakers, and future audiences, the 2022 DocPitch fundraising forum will launch with a virtual conversation on Friday, April 29 at 10:00 AM (PT) moderated by DocLands Director of Programming Joni Cooper. The selection committee comprised of Julie Campfield, ROCO Films; Joni Cooper, DocLands; Denae Peters, Perspective Fund; Eric Johnson, Trailblazer Studios; and Ken Jacobson, DocLands, have chosen five feature-film projects currently in early-to-late stages of completion to participate in DocPitch 2022.

The filmmaker pitches will be available to view by audiences globally on Friday, April 29 at 10:00 AM (PT). Voting for the Audience Award will be open through Sunday, May 8 at 11:59 PM (PT). Four Industry Awards and one Audience Award will be announced Wednesday, May 11 at 10:00 AM (PT) during a virtual conversation with all five filmmaking teams.

Through viewing the pitches and casting their vote, the audience will decide which project will receive the \$45,000 Audience Award. The additional \$55,000 will be awarded to the remaining four film teams through a juried selection.

Funding for this project is made possible with support from the Nancy P. & Richard K. Robbins Family Foundation, Project No. 9, and Resonance Philanthropies.

This year's jury of industry professionals includes – **Paola Mottura**, Director, Film Fund, Sundance Institute Documentary Film Program; **Jeffrey Winter**, Co-executive Director, The Film Collaborative; and **Chi-hui Yang**, Senior Program Officer, JustFilms, Creativity and Free Expression, Ford Foundation.

The five previous DocPitch Audience Award winners include Theo Rigby's **Sanctuary Rising** (2017), now available online; James LeBrecht & Nicole Newnham's 2020 Independent Spirit Award winning documentary **Crip Camp** (2018), which Netflix acquired, and was nominated in the Best Documentary Feature category at the 2020 Academy Awards®; Chris Temple & Zach Ingrasci's **Five Years North** (2019), which screened at many film festivals, including DocLands 2020; Dianne Whelan's **500 Days in the Wild** (2020) completion scheduled for 2024; and Maren Poitras' **Finding the Money** (2021) completion planned for 2023.
